Silverton's School Districts

During the selection process for our SHSAA 2019 honorary graduate, we discovered that awardee Nellie Savage Watson was the first district clerk for both the new Silverton Union High School 7J and Silverton Elementary 4C districts in 1954. Board members were interested in why, how, and when the U was added to SUHS and when it was taken away. I immediately thought that this was a great research project for the Silverton Country Historical Society's expert researcher, Fred A. Parkinson.

He excitedly accepted the challenge and spent many hours in the Silverton museum basement going through the Silverton Appeal-Tribune newspaper archives. Thank you to Fred for helping uncover the mystery! The results of his research are revealed in the following article:

An old two-story wood-framed building stands on North Third Street near the east end of High Street in Silverton. Built in 1862 as a two-room schoolhouse at the corner of North Water and Park Streets, this structure is generally acknowledged as the oldest building still standing in Silverton. It would ultimately be moved to its present location prior to the construction of both the Emerson and then Eugene Field Schools on the same site. Although the building has not been used as a school for more than 130 years, the building stands as a testament to the venerable education

system Silverton has enjoyed since the city's founding in 1854.

Silverton School District 4 was organized in September 1855 to manage the education of local students. As the student population grew over the next one-hundred years, the need for more space resulted in the construction of a series of school facilities including the Emerson, Washington Irving, 1915 high school, Eugene Field, and Schlador Street high school buildings.

At the same time, numerous small schools with names like Porter, Harmony, Grassy Pond, and Hult were established in the surrounding areas, each complete with its own organized school district. By the 1940s, many of these schools sent their high school students to Silverton on a tuition basis since they lived outside the District 4 boundaries. By the 1950s, many of the rural districts had absorbed or "consolidated" (hence the "C" after some district numbers) adjacent districts in order to operate more efficiently.

During the early 1950s, the Oregon State Department of Education classified the current junior high building (aka the 1915 high school) as "nonstandard" and threatened to withhold state education funding to District 4 unless the facility was brought up to spec, which could render the building unusable due to the high cost of renovation. If the junior high building became unusable, students could potentially be housed in the under-utilized high school building, but at the expense of possibly excluding some out-of-district tuition students.

Of several alternatives proposed to deal with the situation, consolidating grades k-12 in the outlying districts with Silverton District 4 was the option chosen. Two early consolidation attempts occurred in 1953 between Silverton School District 4 and two rural districts. District 33C, a consolidated district comprising Evans Valley, McLaughlin, Dunigan, and part of the Briar Nob districts, rejected consolidation, while Silver Falls District 85, a small area above Silver Falls State Park, approved it. The Silverton school district became District 4C for the first time.

As discussions regarding consolidation progressed, and although the Silverton School Board and Superintendent Howard Balderstone were in favor of complete consolidation, it became clear that residents in the rural districts were not interested, fearing losing local control of their younger children's education, thus halting any attempt at consolidation.

SILVERTON HIGH SCHOOL ALUMNI EXPLANATION AND STATEMENT OF GOALS

The Silverton High School Alumni Association (Tax ID #20-2021613) maintains a 501,(c),(3) tax designation and contributions are tax deductible. The Alumni Association has been created specifically to:

1. develop perpetual funding for Silverton High School student scholarships,
2. become a clearing house for Alumni information by collecting and maintaining a computer data base to assist in class reunion organization,
3. provide Bulk Mail Permit for class mailing (Minimum 250 items),
4. become a holding agency for class funds between reunions, and
5. provide information to Alumni through a semi-annual newsletter.

Forming a new union high school district encompassing Silverton and the rural areas and leaving the rural districts intact for elementary students was then proposed. The plan included participation by Silverton, Evergreen, Brush Creek, Evans Valley, Central Howell, Victor Point, Bethany, Silver Crest, Crooked Finger, and parts of Monitor, Scotts Mills, and Butte Creek school districts.

Under this arrangement, the site for the new union high school would be the current high school, which would be sold by District 4C to the new union high district. The sale would provide funds to finance a new junior high school.

Voters approved unification in the spring of 1954, creating the new union high school District 7. The first school board consisted of Robert Humphreys, John Plas, John Siems, Felix Wright, and Fred Schwab, who was elected chairman.

For the next forty years, Districts 4C and 7J operated in tandem, ultimately paving the way for two new schools for 4C; Mark Twain Junior High, opening in 1957, and Robert Frost Elementary, opening in 1971. District 7J voters approved a \$15 million bond levy in 1994 for a new starter high school.

To allow school districts to operate more efficiently, the 1991 Oregon Legislature enacted SB 917, which provided for the unification of all union high school districts with their component elementary districts by September 1, 1996. Districts not unifying by that date would have their districts created by the county boundary board.

The theory was that by unifying districts, the curriculum could be standardized and neighborhood homeowners would be taxed more

fairly. Conversely, smaller districts feared losing local control as well as additional funding. The Scotts Mills and Silver Crest school boards voted against unification, ensuring the involuntary formation of the new district, and thus limiting local ability to formulate the terms of the merger. The Scotts Mills board felt the limitations were worth it in case the law changed, which it never did, although both the 1995 and 1997 Oregon Legislatures passed legislation to repeal unification for those districts that hadn't already done so.

These repeal efforts were popular in Silverton. In fact, at the urging of several rural districts, the District 7J Board drafted a letter of support for HB 2352, the 1997 repeal effort sponsored by Rep. Roger Beyer, R-Molalla. The Governor ultimately vetoed that bill as he had the 1995 legislation.

The new Silver Falls School District was created on June 1, 1997. The adjacent elementary school districts of Bethany, Butte Creek, Central Howell, Evergreen, Monitor, Scotts Mills, Silver Crest, Silverton Elementary, and Victor Point ceased to exist as a result of unification.

It's unclear whether administrators were aware of the old Silver Falls School District 85 when the new name was adopted, but the name seemed to be appropriate considering Silver Creek Falls had long been associated with the Silverton Country.

The vision of total consolidation of rural districts with Silverton, first proposed in 1953, finally came to fruition, by way of a legislative mandate, in 1997. It only took forty years to do so.

Honorary Diplomas - 2019

Nellie Savage Watson moved with her family from Bremerton, Washington to the Victor Point Community in 1939 so her father could help her grandfather on the farm that her great grandfather, Dr. John Savage, homesteaded in 1848.

She attended Silverton High School for a short time her senior year before leaving to attend Salem Business School. Upon graduating, she immediately worked as a bookkeeper for the Salem Firestone tire store. Soon thereafter she married Bob Watson and became employed first in the Business Office of the State Hospital and then in administration at the Marion County Courthouse.

In 1954 as the Silverton High School District unified, she started her career as the District clerk for the 4C and 7J school districts in Silverton. She first worked at Eugene Field School, then later at the district office when it moved to the High School on Schlador Street. She remained at that location until retiring in 1981.

After retirement, she and Bob moved to Salem and enjoyed fishing and taking cruises. She has been living at the Lancaster Village Retirement Community for 13 years and is 97 this year.

Doris Hartley

Doris Hartley was born in Aumsville, Oregon in 1928. She graduated from Salem High School in 1947 and then attended Linfield College where she graduated in 1951 with a Bachelor's degree in Sociology. Upon graduation she worked for the State of Oregon as a social worker until 1954.

In 1953, she married Tom Hartley, and moved to Silverton. After leaving her job as a social worker, she became a mother and farmers' wife. She also volunteered for years at the Marion County Well-Child Clinic.

In 1967, when the Well-Child Clinic was at Mark Twain School, over a cup of coffee, she was offered a job at the school as a Library Aide. That began her career with the 4C school district.

She became Secretary of Mark Twain in 1971 and was there until she moved to a position at Robert Frost School as their Secretary in 1981. She retired in 1992 after nearly 30 years' service in Silverton schools.

Through the years, Doris has enjoyed many hours volunteering at the Silverton Country Historical Museum, Silverton Public Library, Silverton Chapter PEO, and Silverton United Methodist Church.

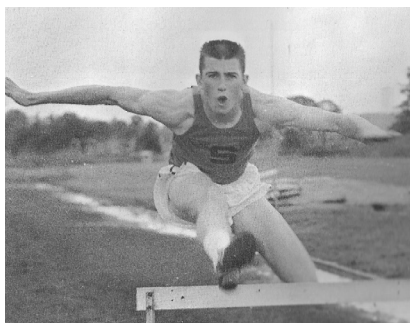

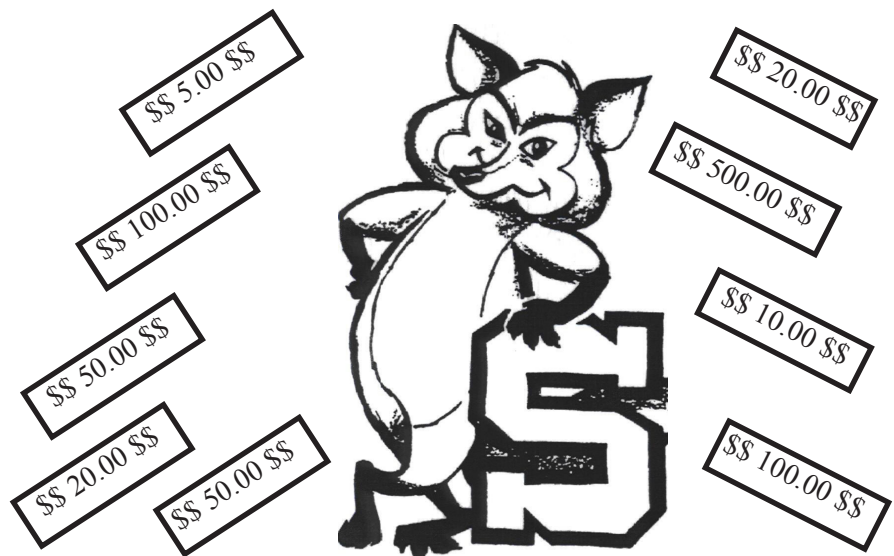
