## Dr. Peter Loar Lore

#### Part 1

For many years, the students of SHS have been beneficiaries of scholarships from the Estate of Dr. Peter and Marie Loar. Originally, the funds were set up as a loan fund through First National Bank of Oregon to be paid back by the student. Since 1997, the fund, with Wells Fargo as the Trustee and SHSAA selecting the recipients, has provided scholarships that did not have to be paid back. Several months ago, Wells Fargo decided to terminate the trust and transfer the funds to SHSAA thus removing Wells Fargo from the process. As of the date of this newsletter, the termination is in process and documents for the transfer are being prepared. Fred Parkinson, Jr. has done some extensive research on the life of Dr. Loar. The following article gives a history of the early Silverton Doctor and his contributions to the Silverton community.

Silverton has enjoyed a long history of community involvement by its citizens. This was especially true of Silverton's physicians, those stalwart professionals charged with keeping the good people of Silverton healthy. During the first half of

the twentieth century, three names, in particular, stand out, although there were certainly others of note as well. These three had long records of community involvement spanning nearly half a century each. The first two that come to mind, and certainly noteworthy in their own right, are Dr. Clarence Keene and Dr. Rudolph Kleinsorge. The last of these three came to Silverton in 1910, practicing during the same era as Keene and Kleinsorge. That doctor was Peter A. Loar.

Peter Andrew Loar was born on July 9, 1879 in Betsy Layne, Kentucky, the site of the infamous feud between two families named Hatfield and McCoy. In fact, according to the 1996 Silverton Hospital publication entitled Silverton Hospital, A Service to the Community Forever, Loar was acquainted with descendants of both families. He graduated from the University of Kentucky Medical School in 1903 and then practiced medicine in Pikeville Kentucky for around eight years. He married Betty St. Clair "Clair" Gillespie in 1906 and then moved to Silverton in 1910. The July 15, 1910 issue of the Silvertonian Appeal heralded his arrival in town as coming "highly recommended as a physician and has



Diplomas are also presented posthumously to recognize significant historical contributors to Silverton youth and their extraordinary Go Foxes Spirit. #### Darlene Fogarty Beyerle

Darlene received her Bachelors of Science and Masters of Education from Oregon State University with honors and her Leadership and Administration degrees from Portland State University. She taught as a business educator at North Salem High School, Tillamook High School, and South Salem High School before joining Silverton Union High School.

Darlene worked for 31 years in Silverton. Initially she was a business education teacher and FBLA advisor and was involved in student activities at the local and state level for 15 years. She supervised the Business, Industrial Arts, and Fine Arts Departments where she coordinated curriculums, budgets and supervision of staff in the elective programs. In 1990 Darlene joined the Guidance counselor department where she supervised college planning and scholarship programs, department budget preparation and presentation, hiring and coordinating professional development of staff, as well as overseeing the Teen Parent, Natural Helpers and START programs. In 1993 she became Assistant Principal with responsibilities for curriculum development, supervising and hiring staff, and coordinating the Evening school

and PASS programs. A unique opportunity and major responsibility at that time was coordinating the design and development of Phase One of the new high school campus with the architect and staff over a period of 3 years. She was the Assistant Principal in the new building and then assumed the role of Principal of the split campuses until retiring.

Darlene's commitment to education and the district after retiring included working with the district as a special projects advisor at the administrative level. She worked with the ESD on Crisis Team Responses, as a School and Colleges Accreditation Team Evaluator, on area School Safety Evaluation teams and as a member of the Chemeketa Office Advisory Committee and Regional Educational Reform Presenter.

In retirement she enjoys reading and outside activities including gardening, hiking, and traveling.

#### Eileen N Williams

Eileen graduated from Maui High School, Kahului, Hawaii in 1962 and received her Bachelors in Education, Oregon College of Education (OCE), Monmouth, Oregon in 1966. While working for the Teaching Research Division at OCE (1968-1970) she researched the interactions of "colors and music" with preschoolers. Her research was instrumental in the creation of "Sesame Street" TV program.

Eileen was an Elementary school teacher for 32 years in the Silver Falls School District.

After retirement in 2001, she returned to teaching as the District's Math Teacher on Special Assignment and as an elementary education Math Intervention Teacher. She remains active in education as a tutor/mentor for the After School Activity Program serving 6, 7, & 8th grade students.

She served as a Director for the Silverton High School Scholarship Fund (SHSSF) from 1997 to 2008 when that Fund merged with the SHS Alumni Association (SHSAA).

She continues her valuable service to the Silverton High School community by assisting in the annual evaluation and selection of many alumni scholarships.

As an SHSSF Director and an SHSAA Scholarship Evaluator she has been a key participant in the awarding of over 1,600 scholarships totaling more than \$1,200,000 during the last 20 plus years.

The recently enacted COVID-19 stimulus bill called the "CARES Act" expands charitable deductions for those individuals who are not eligible to itemize deductions.

For individuals who take the Standard Deduction on their 2020 tax return, you can now claim a new deduction of \$300 in charitable cash donations without itemizing deductions. This allows you to support SHSAA in addition to getting a tax deduction. As with all deductions related to your income taxes, please consult your tax advisor before taking this deduction to ensure you qualify.

Dr. Loar -- continued from Page 1. the appearance ob veing a very desirable citizen." No finer sentiment had ever proven to be so true concerning Dr. Loar.

Upon his arrival in town, Loar rented the former F. E. Wray house that still stands today on the northeast corner of East Main and Second Streets, and began seeing patients out of his home. By March 1912, he had set up his practice in an office upstairs in the Smith Building over the (then) Brooks and Steelhammer Drugstore on East Main St., which now houses the Towne House lounge. That same year he moved into his newly-built craftsman home at 211 Coolidge Street that would be his residence for the next several decades. In early 1918 he moved his office across the west stairway into a larger office space in the adjacent (then) Ames (now Wolf) building where he would remain until his retirement. The paper noted this change by observing: "The same stairway is used from the street in calling on the doctor, (sic) the difference is when you reach the top turn to the left instead of the right as formerly." These stairs still provide access to the upper floors of both buildings as they have done for one hundred years.

In mid-1919 a new dentist, Dr. Carl R. Wilson, came to town and took over the office of his predecessor, Dr. Christopherson, across the hall from Dr. Loar. Coincidentally, the Wilsons would eventually take up residence next to the Loars on Coolidge Street and would ultimately raze the old and then build a new home on the same lot. The two families remained good friends for decades until Wilson's passing in 1958.

By 1919 Dr. Loar had purchased

a large tract of land up in the Silverton Hills that would remain his source of inspiration, enjoyment, and exercise for the rest of his life. One source indicated the property covered 620 acres. There was probably an abundance of timber on the land since the Silverton Appeal reported in the November 14, 1919 issue: "Dr. P. A. Loar expects to begin operations next week in cutting down and clearing off his ranch in the Silverton Hills." The land was undoubtedly close to the present site of Silver Crest School, since it is situated on Loar Road SE.

Dr. Loar was a man of many interests. During much of his life he was an avid hunter and fisherman. He raised Beagle hounds to assist with hunting wild game. There were numerous accounts of his hunting prowess chronicled in the local newspaper. The September 12, 1919 Silverton Appeal related how Dr. Loar and his frequent hunting partner, J. L. Eidson, would be enjoying venison roasts as a result of bagging a deer in the Abiqua District the previous weekend.

Not content to be merely pursuing deer, one month later, Dr. Loar was in a hunting party with J. L. Eidson and Charles Webb when they found themselves in pursuit, along with six hounds (possibly Beagle hounds raised by Dr. Loar), of a black bear roaming the Silverton Hills. The chase lasted for more than five hours before the bear was brought to bay by the hounds. During the excitement, two other Silverton residents, R. B. Mount and Cal Schlador, were also hunting in the area. Mount was surprised by the elusive bear while sitting on a log, but was too

startled to bring his rifle to bear (pun intended). Near the end of the hunt, the bear was literally "up a tree," being watched by Mount until other hunters arrived. When Mount went to get a drink of water, the bear slid down the tree and was again chased by the dogs only to come within the sights of Charles Webb, who fired the fatal shot. The paper reported, in a descriptive article of the affair: "The fur is extra fine for this time of year and will be made into a rug. Bear meat was on sale at the Eidson Meat Market the forepart (sic) of the week."

Dr. Loar was also known to have kept several colonies of bees, both at his home on Coolidge Street and on his ranch in the Hills. One former neighbor remembers the bees having their own room in the Loar basement, from which they could come and go, adding: "the honey was so good!" Dr. Loar had numerous fruit trees in his back vard and an orchard at his Hills property, so it stands to reason that in addition to providing honey, the bees were also used to pollinate the fruit trees. The neighbor related recently that the bees once escaped their basement lodgings, only to find a new home in a tree a halfblock from the Loar home. Experienced bee-keeper that he was, Dr. Loar donned his protective gear and promptly brought the wayward hive home.

During his years in Silverton, Dr. Loar pursued numerous interests, both personal and professional. These pursuits coincided with a high degree of civic-mindedness. His long career of professional and community service will be chronicled in Part 2.

# The More Things Stay the Same...

Driving through Silverton these days, you will notice a huge change. Several little shops are not open for business as well as all of our eateries. 'Take Out' only on several signs has become the new normal for our small town, the entire state as well as most other states.

Wondering how the Spanish Flu had impacted Silverton, I did a little research. Since the museum does not have copies of the 1918 Appeal, I used the 1919 edition to see how our town had responded.

The following articles show the many issues that are a striking parallel to today's pandemic. The one article that interested me the most was the one discussing the social gatherings. So many of our local celebrations have been cancelled, schools are closed, we stand six feet apart, we wear masks, and washing hands has become an obsession. The teacher in me causes me to empathize with the students and teachers who have lost their classrooms, which are not just for textbook learning but also for social interaction.

Graduations are such an important part of life and a major step for a student and their families. Not just eighth grade but high schools and university graduations have been cancelled, which will forever change the way this generation remembers their class of 2020.

Hopefully, the lessons to be learned from the past will help us to prepare for the future.

'Those who do not remember the past are condemned to repeat it.' George Santayana. 'Our greatest glory is not in never falling, but in rising every time we fall.' Confucius. We hope all of our friends and families are staying safe and healthy.

Following are two articles from the **Silverton Appeal** from 1919, 101 years ago:

INFLUENZA RAGES FOLLOWING GATHERINGS Jan. 3, 1919

Three Days after Public Gatherings Influenza Breaks Out in Another Wave

A careful analysis of all data obtainable in regard to the present epidemic of influenza shows the following striking features, from which most valuable deductions can be drawn in considering control measures:

Three days after an unusual gathering of people there is an increase in the number of cases reported. Thus, every Thursday is high because of Saturday and Sunday minglings; the 28th of December was high following Christmas; the 3rd and 4th of January were high following New Year's festivities. Therefore, dances constitute the greatest number of cases. Dances therefore should be prohibited during the epidemic.

The waves of the epidemic run in about three week intervals. A study of the causes of this and the matter of carriers, indicate that many cases remain carriers for a period of two or three weeks. The greatest number of severe cases during a wave are able to be up and around in about three weeks and are unconsciously spreading the disease causing the next wave.

Therefore, in addition to the ten days quarantine, each recovered case should wear a mask for a period of two or three weeks in the presence of unexposed persons, and all persons coming in close contact with the sick should wear masks. Masks, to be effective, should be sufficiently large to completely cover the nose and mouth. They should have at least eight layers of gauze and should be sterilized after three hours use.

Sterilizing is easily accomplished by dropping the mask in boiling water for ten minutes.

It has been discovered that the disease is being spread to a greater extent than has been realized by utensils used in eating and drinking. Therefore all dishes, cups, glasses, knives, and forks, etc., used in eating or drinking in all public places, and in all private homes or public institutions wherever there are cases of influenza, should be thoroughly sterilized by boiling 15 minutes.

Of 91 physicians, 48 comment favorably on the use of vaccine, especially in preventing the graver complications; some are quite enthusiastic and 46 made no comment.

The report from the Bremerton navy yard, using the same vaccine is as follows: Number inoculated 4,212, of this number 144 contracted influenza, 112 of whom the onset began before the inoculation was completed. There were no deaths. There were 8,486 who were not vaccinated. There occurred 1,409 cases of influenza in this group, 96 of whom died. ~~State Board of Health.

FLU SITUATION AGAIN BAD IN THIS CITY Jan. 31, 1919

The flu situation is again looking bad in this city, a number of deaths having occurred from it recently. The quarantining of the homes is not being carried out as planned, as it is reported some residents resent the placing of the placards on their homes.

The school board is considering closing the schools and if the situation remains the same, to all probability these will be closed Friday night.


