Silverton High Alumni Reflects Back on 9/11

Editor's note: The following are reflections on the events of September 11, 2001, as experienced by SUHS alumni Jeff Marcoe. He resided in the Washington, DC area and worked near the White House on that day.

Marcoe has retired from the U.S. Chamber of Commerce after 33 years of service and returned to Silverton in 2020.

He was inspired to share his 9/11 story on Facebook due to the pleasant temperatures and clear blue skies that occurred in the Silverton area on the 20th anniversary weekend. It matched perfectly the DC weather of that historic day.

The incongruity of beautiful weather amidst horrific violence and national tragedy is an enduring memory that continues to haunt him.

Today in Silverton it's a lovely weather day, just like it was 20 years ago in New York City and Washington, DC.

On that particular morning, I arrived to a senior staff meeting at just past 9:00 a.m. at the U.S. Chamber of Commerce, located directly across from the White House.

Moments earlier, I had seen on television the second tower in New York get hit. I entered the crowded meeting room. This was before smartphones. No one else there knew about the second plane crash. I hesitated about being the bearer of horrifying news.

Fortunately, a secretary soon came into the room and handed the person leading the meeting a note updating her about what was happening at the World Trade Center. The meeting soon adjourned and I raced back to my office to catch the latest.

At no point did I consider that attacks on DC might be next. The national newscasters were giving live reports about the two burning

towers when all of the sudden that broadcast was interrupted by a local TV station reporting that a plane may have crashed into the nearby Pentagon.

Without hesitation, I raced to the sixth floor of the Chamber building where you could look toward the Pentagon and Reagan National Airport. Sure enough, large clouds of foul smoke were billowing into the sky in the vicinity of the Pentagon. The report was sadly true.

I raced back down to my floor and informed the executive staff, who were unaware of the Pentagon attack.

A few minutes later, I could see a large rush of people running in a panic across Lafayette Park away from the White House. I subsequently learned that it was the employees who work at the White House complex. Right behind them were uniformed Secret Service officers, heads up looking toward the sky and with their guns carried along their chest and shoulders.

The agents' stern running posture, their fully extended weapons, and their fear stricken faces sent a chill down my spine. I had never witnessed anything like that before in the 15 years I had worked near the White House. It was the only moment that day that I truly felt scared for my personal safety.

Just then, the sound of two low flying jets roared above us. Several of my colleagues were frightened by the noise, but I sensed intuitively that those planes were the good guys, our own military coming to the defense of the Nation's Capital. And I was right.

Those two unarmed military planes were doing a pass over the city with orders to crash into any unauthorized jetliners entering the DC airspace.

Fortunately, those military pilots were spared from making the ultimate sacrifice due to the patriotism and courage of the passengers on Flight 93, who did make the ultimate sacrifice that saved countless lives in DC. God Bless those brave heroes who fought for their country that terrible day.

Within a few minutes thereafter, bedlam broke out all over city.

People had one common gut reaction. America was under attack and DC was on the target list.

People wanted to leave work and go to the one place that felt relatively safe: home.

But nearly everyone was attempting to do just that at the same exact time. It resulted in one unsurprising outcome: The biggest traffic jam in DC history.

Cars and buses were stuck on the streets and in alley-ways going nowhere fast.

A rumor was also going around that a car bomb had gone off at the State Department. Another rumor was that the Metro Subway was shutdown citywide. Neither rumor was true. But it added to the sense of danger and chaos.

Many people smartly chose to walk home and the DC bridges were soon filled with thousands of pedestrians crossing the Potomac River into Virginia.

I, too, succumbed to the false rumor about the Metro shutdown. I asked a stranger if I could catch a ride in his car to cross the River into Arlington, Virginia. He kindly agreed and we both sat in his car motionless for 20 minutes as nothing moved in front of us. Finally, I left the car to see if the nearby subway was actually running. It was and I jumped on board. By noon I was back home in Arlington.

As I walked the 2/3 mile from the subway station to my house, I was struck by how beautiful the weather was. Gorgeous deep blue sky. Mildly warm temps with low humidity. Totally perfect. It was a strange juxtaposition against the horrible events of the day. I could never reconcile those conflicting facts. It continues to befuddle me.

Later that evening, exhausted after watching all the nonstop television coverage and engaging in several landline phone calls to Oregon and the DC area to assure my loved ones that I was safe, I stepped out for a badly needed walk around my neighborhood.

My favorite neighbor cat soon came up to me. It was a big, blackish cat with gray stripes up and down its back. I stooped onto my knees to give it all the love I was capable of sharing.

Above me, I could hear the stark sound of the F-16 war planes that were now flying above to protect the city. While I was thankful that the planes were there, the harsh noise of their engines was jarring and a stark sign that things were not peaceful or normal in my world.

I petted the cat even more intensely and as I did so gentle tears unexpectedly started to pour out of me. First, it was just a few sprinkles, then gradually the tears started to flow like a river. This went on for several minutes. The cat responded to my unusual grief by purring more loudly and kneading its paws against my thighs.

I was so grateful for those moments of love and compassion between a distressed man and a gentle animal.

I wiped my tears as I walked home to try to get some sleep. It eventually came several hours later. As I slept, September 11, 2001, became history. The Day After would soon begin.

Silverton High School's first graduating class was in 1908. As of today, there has been a total of 113 graduating classes from Silverton High School. The past 5 years SHSAA has "Challenged" all alumni classes for their class to be the top scholarship fundraiser.

With only a small number of those classes participating in 2021, SHSAA is encouraging all class representatives to reach out to their class members to join in the challenge.

As class representatives you could take on the challenge as a group or find a class member to take the challenge on for your class. The three top fundraising classes will be recognized for their fundraising by having a one-time scholarship named in their class's honor.

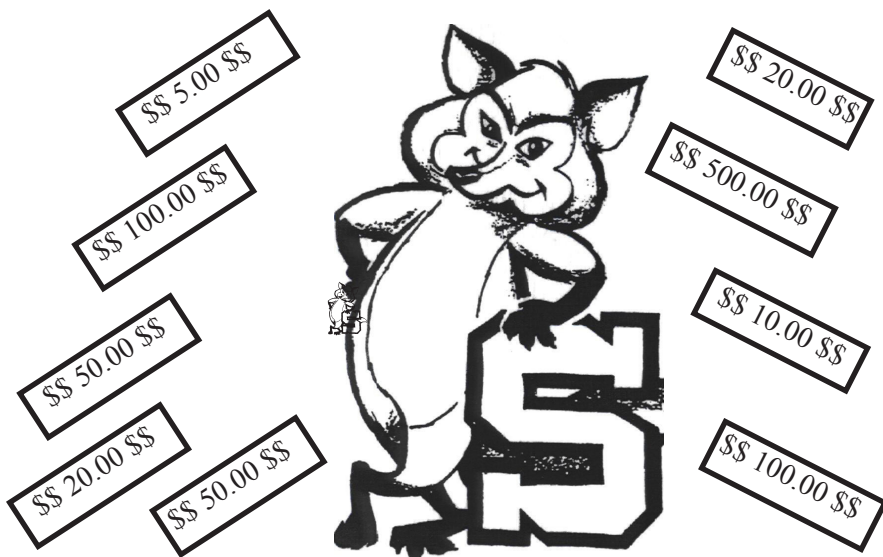
