Senior Bench

Repeated from December 2009 issue. Written by Judy Nunn '60 with assistance of Bob Wiesner '54.

The concrete bench was originally installed at the second high school in Silverton in 1920. This was the new building next to the Washington Irving building on First Street. The high school was built on First St. in 1915 and became the Jr. High when the high school on Schlador Street was built in 1939. The senior bench was left at the First Street school until 1957. The 1915 high school and the Washington Irving building were both torn down to make room for the First Christian Church.

In 2009, Norman Wiesner ('73) was attending a school board meeting. There was a discussion to move the senior bench from the high school on Schlador St. to the newest high school on Pine Street. 2009 marked the last year for seniors to occupy the Schlador St. facility. It was thought that moving the bench would be a good idea, but nobody at the meeting seemed to know that it had been moved once before. Norman talked to his brother Bob ('54) and Bob decided to follow up on the idea of moving the bench

Bob Wiesner went to the Silverton Library and reviewed the microfilm from past issues of Silverton Appeal-Tribune. In doing so, he discovered that the bench was actually moved in 1957. This was confirmed by Mayor Stu Rasmussen ('66). He was sure that Sanford Seed had moved it. The next contact was with John Sanford ('57) and he confirmed that one of

the Sanford employees moved it with a 15,000 pound forklift.

The next step was to find someone to move the bench. Bob measured the actual bench and the weight was calculated by measuring the width, height and length of the bench, converting that to cubic feet by the weight of cement. The result was that the estimated weight of the bench must be 13,000 to 15,000 pounds.

With that information, Bob contacted Rick Mallorie ('78) of Mallorie's Dairy. He was quite willing to move it and has the proper equipment to do so. Dennis Maulding ('66) agreed to donate gravel for the base and Bob Klaus ('60) agreed to haul it. Wilco sandblasted the bench to remove 50 years of paint. The volunteers *donated* their time, equipment and materials.

The projected date was planned for the Sunday during Homer Days, with the idea that many alumni will be in town for the annual SHS Alumni Fundraiser. However, there were a few details to work out. Bob continued to pursue the moving of the bench.

He managed to get the insurance forms filled out and the bench actually moved on Aug. 16, 2009. But again there was a problem in getting it "planted".

The sprinkler system was working and the ground too wet to approach with 15,000 pounds of cement (in the form of a bench).

Craig Roessler and Mark Hannan responded and were familiar with the community's interest in the project. The Alumni Association continued to monitor and be a medium for the interest being shown without taking leadership in the project.

Finally, the bench was installed at Pine Street campus. On August 23, 2009, Rick Mallorie, Norman Wiesner and Bob Wiesner met at the new high school. The hole was dug after much measuring. The bench is not flat on the bottom. There are ridges to keep it in place.

"Our Town" sent a photographer and the moving of the bench was featured in their early September edition.

The Class of 2010 put their mark on it during registration week. We hope each graduating class will continue the tradition of painting the bench.

Temp Away

We mail our Alumni Newsletter twice a year, on the third Tuesday of May and November. Please add the SHSAA to your change of address list.

If you're a "snowbird" and move at either of those times, please let us know of your temporary address. We can change your address for just that one mailing. The newsletters are sent BULK MAIL and the post office does not forward those, even if you've given a forwarding address. They are tossed and/or returned to us. We also have to pay sixty-seven cents to be notified of your "Temp Away" status.

Quite often I receive an Email asking why a person did not receive a newsletter. We keep a copy of the labels so we can tell if that person was actually on the mailing list. Many times the answer is yes, the newsletter was mailed and yes to the address we have on file. However, when looking over the returned newsletters, there's that person's newsletter with "Temp Away" stamped on it by the post office.

If that person is a paid member, we will send out another newsletter. Usually that's about \$2.00 for First Class, which is the way a second one would have to be sent. We get a great discount when all the newsletters are sent via bulk mail. But you add sixty-seven cents for the notice that they were temporarily away and another \$2.00 to send a second copy, and our costs really go up. Keep in mind this additional expense takes away

from our bank balance, and in turn can reduce the amount we have available for scholarships.

So please, if you intend to change your address in May or November, let us know ahead of time. We can put in a temporary address for the one mailing, and immediately change it back to your "normal" address for the next issue.

CLASS CHALLENGE 2023 Many components go into the growing of the SHS Alumni Association Scholarship fund. The newest is the Class Challenge which was started five years ago when the Class of 1959 challenged other classes to help raise money for scholarships. That year, several classes took up the challenge and raised \$3,400. In the following years more and more Alumni and their classes took up the Challenge which resulted in more money being raised for Scholarships. This activity allowed us to continue to raise money for scholarships even when the annual fundraiser event was cancelled due to the Pandemic in 2020 and 2021. Since 2017, the SHSAA Class Challenge has raised \$157,363 for scholarships.

This year we had 28 classes participate by donating a total of \$28,908 to the Challenge. It was a close race between the first and second place classes and the 3rd and 4th place classes.

This year the Class of 1961 pulled ahead of the Class of 1960 by raising \$8,534 by 17 classmates to win the 2022 Class Challenge. In addition to raising the most money, they also had the most classmates that participated. Thanks go out to Carmen Smith who has continued to follow up with her classmates to encourage them to donate. SHSAA will be awarding a scholarship in 2023 to a graduating senior in their class name for winning first place in the challenge.

Second place in the 2022 Class Challenge goes to the Class of 1960 for raising \$8,125 and the Class of 1952 won third place for raising \$4,350.

Thank you to everyone who donated to the Challenge this year. The 2023 Class Challenge is officially open now so make your donations early and get your classmates to participate. In addition to editing the newsletter, I also keep the Alumni database up to date. The Class Reps help by sending me the changes of address for their classmates. This is a constant job. I am always receiving Emails with address changes.

Reunion Preparation:

Most reunions are held after a 5-year period (5, 10, 15, 20, etc.). Each year we concentrate on whatever year ends in a 5-year period from the date of graduation. For instance, for 2022 we mailed complimentary copies of the newsletter to all classes ending in 7 and 2.

We'll send complimentary copies of next June (2023) newsletter to classes ending in 3 and 8. Contact us if your class will have a reunion in 2023.

Let this be a "heads up" to *you*. Start working on your mailing list now. We suggest you begin with a list from the Alumni Association. Request a class roster, compare it with what information you currently have, and work from there. The Post Office does not forward our newsletters. If one is sent out with a bad address (i.e., to someone who has moved), the newsletter is returned to us at a cost of 67¢. If the move has been within the past six months, the Post Office will provide us with a current address. Many times, however, we pay for the return only to get

it stamped with "Moved - No Forwarding Address" or "FOE" (Forwarding order expired).

So let's work together. Contact me for a Class Roster. Let me help you get a head start on your reunion for next year. If you'd like to check our list, just send an Email to: Nunnjk@comcast.net. Be sure to put your class year in the subject line. You may phone me with the request at (503) 390-3816 - leave a message if I'm not home and PLEASE be sure to leave your area code and phone number in case I have to contact you.
